# The HSRC Diversity Scholarship

The HSRC Diversity Scholarship is an annual \$5,000 scholarship designed to support the education of NC undergraduate students who are interested in exploring transportation-related areas of study. The goal of the HSRC Diversity Scholarship is to encourage Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) undergraduate students interested in pursuing a career in transportation safety. A call for applications will be issued each spring, and candidates will be evaluated on essay responses, as well as community involvement, leadership, academic performance, and career goals.

## **Eligibility Requirements**

The HSRC Diversity Scholarship is open to all students enrolled full-time in an undergraduate program at any of the University of North Carolina system campuses. Transportationrelated areas of study include, but are not limited to: computer science and data analytics, communications, engineering, environmental studies, occupational therapy, city and regional planning, public health and epidemiology, public administration, and psychology.

#### To be eligible, students must:

- Be currently enrolled in an undergraduate program at a University of North Carolina system campus.
- Be interested in exploring a transportationrelated areas of study.
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Be involved in their community.

BIPOC students are strongly encouraged to apply.

# The HSRC Diversity Scholarship

Transportation is a broad field that includes professionals who work in multidisciplinary topic areas, including, but not limited to, driver behavior, city and regional planning, public health, and environmental issues. Our profession can only become more diverse and better serve our communities if more students, practitioners, and researchers from different backgrounds and experiences are supported to enter the transportation profession. HSRC is invested in fostering this important change. The goal of the HSRC Diversity Scholarship is to encourage Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) undergraduate students interested in pursuing a career in transportation safety.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

The HSRC Diversity Scholarship is open to all students enrolled full-time in an undergraduate program at any of the University of North Carolina system campuses. Students should be enrolled in the fall semester of 2022 and have an interest in the transportation field.

#### To be eligible, students must:

- Be currently enrolled in an undergraduate program at a University of North Carolina system campus.
- Be interested in exploring a transportationrelated areas of study.
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Be involved in their community.

BIPOC students are strongly encouraged to apply. Current HSRC employees, students employed by HSRC after August 1, 2022, and/or relatives of current HSRC employees are not eligible for the scholarship.

#### **Criteria for Evaluation**

All qualified and eligible applications will be reviewed. A review committee of transportation research experts will judge the applicants on the basis of a completed application, the essay responses and an optional recommendation statement. Final evaluation will take into consideration the applicant's community involvement, leadership, academic performance, and career goals. Applicants may be subject to an interview upon the request of the review committee. The review committee also reserves the right to not award the scholarship if necessary.

#### **Procedures**

Individuals meeting the eligibility requirements are invited to complete this application. Completed applications must be submitted by the June 15, 2022 deadline. The student selected to receive this scholarship will be notified in July 2022. Students not selected will be notified shortly thereafter.

#### Awarding of Scholarship

Scholarship funding will be sent directly to the recipient's university financial division for distribution to the student.

- Optional: A letter of reference from a teacher, mentor, advisor, etc. This item is not required, but may be included if you feel it will strengthen your application.
